11.01 ADOPTION BY REFERENCE

The following Minnesota Statutes are hereby adopted by reference.

11.02 DATES OF ELECTIONS, TERMS

Subd. 1. Date of Election. Notwithstanding any other provision in Chapter 11 to the contrary, the regular Municipal election shall be held biennially on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in every even numbered year beginning with the 1974 election.

Subd. 2. Extension of Terms of Council Members. The terms of the Mayor and the council persons whose current terms will expire on the first business day of January 1976 are extended to the first business day of January 1977 and those offices shall be filed at the 1976 city election.

Subd. 3. Terms and Transition. Two council persons shall be elected for four-year terms at each biennial election commencing in 1974. Two Councilmen shall be elected for a four-year term at the 1978 city election. The Mayor shall be elected for a four-year term at each such election commencing in 2002.

11.03 ABSENTEE BALLOT PRECINCT

As authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Revised 1976, Section 207.30. an absentee ballot precinct is hereby established at City Hall, the purpose of which is to receive, transfer and count city-wide absentee ballots.
